



Mandatory Vaccination Program (MVP)

Full vaccination required to enter the LNG Canada Project Site, effective November 30, 2021

Today, JGC Fluor is introducing LNG Canada's Mandatory Vaccination Program (MVP) for the LNG Canada Project. The MVP will require all project personnel and anyone accessing the LNG Canada Project Site to be fully vaccinated by November 30, 2021.

To qualify as "fully vaccinated", a person must have received a full series of a Health Canada-approved COVID-19 vaccine (combinations of approved vaccines are also acceptable) with the last dose having been administered at least fourteen (14) days prior to the MVP effective date.

There will be a short transition period with respect to the Canadian federal government's travel mandate—from October 31, 2021 through November 30, 2021—where Fly-In / Fly-Out (FIFO) workers who travel via charter or commercial flights will be able to access the LNG Canada Project Site if they can show a confirmed, valid, negative COVID-19 molecular test (such as a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test) taken within seventy-two (72) hours prior to the scheduled inbound flight departure time. Contractors are responsible for organizing those COVID-19 molecular tests required for all inbound travel (charter and commercial flights) and costs are to Contractors' accounts. All FIFO workers will still be required to participate in the mandatory rapid COVID-19 testing on the LNG Canada Project Site between day three (3) and five (5) and then again between day eight (8) and ten (10) of their fourteen-day (14-day) rotation.

During the transition period, (October 31, 2021 to November 30, 2021) local workers who are not fully vaccinated will be allowed access to the LNG Canada

Project Site, but will still be required to participate in the mandatory rapid COVID-19 testing on the LNG Canada Project Site on a weekly basis.

JGC Fluor is working with LNG Canada to provide COVID-19 molecular tests at the Cedar Valley Lodge (CVL) to Contractors for outbound FIFO workers during the transition period through JGC Fluor’s medical services provider, International SOS (ISOS) or through LNG Canada’s Contractor, Whitecap, to be administered in the ISOS testing facility in CVL. FIFO workers requiring the COVID-19 molecular test for outbound flights will be required to obtain their test at CVL a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours to a maximum of seventy-two (72) hours before their scheduled flight.

After November 30, 2021 only fully vaccinated persons (FIFO and local resources) will have access to the LNG Canada Project Site.

Those wanting to receive a vaccination are encouraged to do so as soon as possible at their home base or as offered by ISOS in the CVL clinic. Vaccines are available for all LNG Canada Project workers at the CVL clinic between 8 AM and 8:30 PM daily. No appointments are required, walk-ins only.

Please make yourself familiar with the following key dates and details related to the LNG Canada-directed LNG Canada Project MVP, the federal vaccination mandate on transportation, and proof of vaccination:

LNG CANADA MANDATORY VACCINATION PROGRAM		
Roll-out dates	October 20	Unvaccinated workers will need the first dose to allow for the second dose to occur fourteen (14) days prior to the November 30, 2021 deadline to be fully vaccinated. There is a minimum of twenty-eight (28) days required between doses. Any unvaccinated workers after this date must make every effort to be vaccinated with the first dose immediately.
	November 16	Partially vaccinated workers required to have the second dose to meet the November 30, 2021 deadline to be fully vaccinated.
Proof of vaccination	Subject to additional requirements from the federal government, any proof of vaccination issued by a health authority is accepted, including physical and digital vaccination cards.	
Exemptions	For LNG Canada Project personnel who are unable to be vaccinated for verified medical or religious reasons may be exempt from the MVP. <i>*Clarifications on exemptions will be provided in due course.</i>	
FEDERAL VACCINATION MANDATE ON TRANSPORTATION		
The federal government has announced that all travellers must be fully vaccinated by October 30, 2021 , before boarding federally-regulated transportation, including planes, trains, or marine vessels.		

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To qualify as a "fully vaccinated traveller", a person must have received a full series of a Health Canada-approved COVID-19 vaccine (combinations of approved vaccines are also acceptable) with the **last dose having been administered at least fourteen (14) days prior to the day of travel.**

For travellers who are in the process of being vaccinated, there will be a short transition period—from October 31, 2021 through November 30, 2021—where they will be able to travel if they can show a confirmed, valid, negative COVID-19 molecular test taken within seventy-two (72) hours of the scheduled travel.

PROOF OF VACCINATION		
Locations	Charter Flight	FIFO workers will be required to show proof of being fully vaccinated at the charter hub during the COVID-19 test before being allowed to board the charter flight.
	Commercial Flight	FIFO workers will be required to show proof of being fully vaccinated at the COVID-19 test facility in the CVL during the COVID-19 test upon arrival at the LNG Canada Project Site.
	Locals	Local workers will be required to show proof of being fully vaccinated at the COVID-19 test facility in the CVL during the weekly COVID-19 test.
Refusal to show proof of vaccination	Any LNG Canada Project worker who refuses to show proof of being fully vaccinated and who has not been exempted from the MVP, will not be permitted on the LNG Canada Project Site or on LNG Canada Project charter flights. Their site access will be suspended until further notice.
